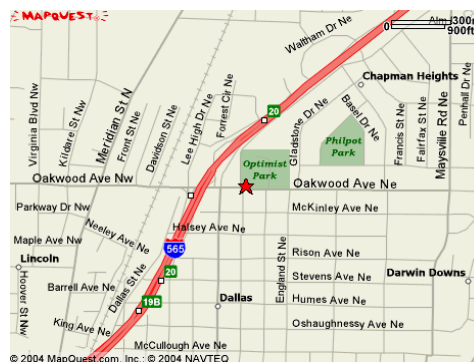

Well, as sad as it may seem down here to us, I'm sure he's up there ripping and roaring in his new car. You will be truly missed, Chris, by both your family and friends. The car community lost a good friend on the 5th of February 2009 when Christopher D. Loudon passed away suddenly. I met Chris in the Huntsville Plastic Modelers over a decade ago and he was an active member and helper/organizer for the former Rocket City Model Car Club. Chris recently told me that he was affected by watching the movie Dirty Harry, Crazy Mary as a small child with his mother. If you know the movie, you remember the yellow Charger. His love for Chargers and MOPARs colored his whole life. Chris had two ('72 and '67) and a Hemi pickup which he cherished. Chris was a long time model builder and member of the Tennessee Valley MOPAR Club. Apart from owning and driving MOPARs he personally ran the model car contests at the annual MOPAR Show-and-Go for a number of years. He worked at the Huntsville Dodge dealer for many years and was an incredible source of information on all things MOPAR and a wonderful source of information to the club membership. His model room contained hundreds of beautifully built cars and kids and many autographed models and memorabilia from the Petty family, all the stars of the Dukes of Hazzard TV show, Bill Greenburg and a host of other NASCAR and MOPAR figures.

Chris and I had recently gotten together to check out the slot car tracks in Decatur and Tanner. One of my slot car collecting friends Dan Carrol of Decatur told me this story about Chris when he heard the news about Chris. It really tells you how active Chris was in the model car shows and clubs in the area.

“Yes Pete, I remember Chris now, a very long time ago, it seems almost a lifetime ago. I had a Model Car Club that had several members. We did shows & won some trophy's etc. It was called "Models Inc" and was strictly static models. At one point somebody made off with several model car collections. I took out an ad in Scale Auto & offered a \$200.00 reward for info leading to the finding of my/our model kits/parts. Well, it was Chris that contacted me. He had all of our stuff that he had bought from some dudes at the Atlanta show for almost nothing. He said that he knew it was all of my stuff pretty much as he had seen it over here at my place years ago. Chris would not take any of the \$200.00 reward even though I insisted!!! He would not. A hell of a man in my book, in fact, Chris told me that he bought the items because he sensed that they were stolen from me & my co-collectors, He KNEW that WE would never sell these items for such a cheap price!!! When Chris returned the materials, that's the last time that I saw him. He was a good Man & I'm sorry to hear of his demise. Yeah, I remember Chris. He was a good person in my book...Dan”
